



- 1 – The coach will treat each player, opposing coach/team, parent, game official and ERYF board member with respect and dignity.
- 2 – The coach will be responsible for controlling the actions of his/her players and parents.
- 3 – Coaches agree to background screening of your application with regards to your suitability to work with children.
- 4 – Coaches are in charge of ensuring paperwork on all players for their team is completed and submitted to the appropriate board member.
- 5 – All coaches will participate in all fundraising efforts.
- 6 – The coach shall not use abusive language against anyone associated with the “game”.
- 7 –The coach shall not use or be under the influence of alcohol drugs or tobacco products.
- 8 – A Parent meeting will be conducted within two days of the beginning of the season to go over rules, expectations, and philosophies of the league.
- 9 – Conduct yourself as a good role model. Be positive and make it fun so that the players want to come back next year.
- 10 – Ensure every player either starts the game on offense or defense and that they play half the game.
- 11 – Complete the appropriate level of certification through the approved ERYF course.
- 12 – Each coach will encourage good sportsmanship.

Failure to abide by the conduct and responsibility rules listed above may result in a probation, suspension or termination to be decided by a majority vote of the Elk River Youth Football Board of Directors.
